SECOND AMENDED DENTON COUNTY TEMPORARY STANDING ORDER REGARDING PARENT-CHILD VISITATION AND OTHER IN-PERSON VISITS IN ALL CHILD PROTECTION CASES

Following the guidance from the Texas Supreme Court, Texas Court of Criminal Appeals, Office Of Court Administration, the Children's Commission and in conjunction with Denton County Public Health, the Denton County District Courts recognize the concerns about COVID-19 (Novel Coronavirus). As such, the health and safety of the public, and all employees, are of utmost concern and this Temporary Standing Order is hereby entered to address these concerns.

The Courts finds that the following orders are in the best interest of the children currently in the Temporary Managing Conservatorship of the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services under the jurisdiction of Denton County District Courts.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED:

- 1. All previously ordered in-person parent-child visitations, sibling visitations, Attorney Ad Litem (AAL) and/or Guardian Ad Litem (GAL) visits, and DFPS visits scheduled to take place May 1, 2020 through June 1, 2020 may occur IF AGREED TO BY ALL PARTIES AND THE CHILD'S PLACEMENT. If the parties and placement cannot agree, the parties may petition the court and request a hearing. If a hearing is set, any party may appear by remote means.
- 2. If in-person visitations are not agreed to, or Ordered under paragraph (1), The Department of Family and Protective Services (DFPS), AALs and GALs are HEREBY ORDERED to make arrangements for telephonic, Zoom, Skype, or FaceTime (or other video platform) communications in place of in-person visitation from May 1, 2020 through June 1, 2020.
- 3. This ORDER shall apply to children who are in relative or fictive kin placements, as well as those in foster placements and residential treatment centers.

This Temporary Order is effective from May 1, 2020, through June 1, 2020 (unless modified).
